Founded in 1985, the Trumansburg After School Program is designed to meet family child care needs. Children who attend the Trumansburg Central School in grades K through 6 may enroll in TASP.

In 2000, the program became a New York State Registered, not-for-profit corporation. We operate according to the New York State School-Age Child Care regulations, Section 414.

TASP has moved out of TCS to start the 2020 school year in the First Presbyterian Church of Ulysses Chapel at 69 East Main Street. We are very excited to creatively change the program in our 35th year of caring for Trumansburg Youth!



## Program Goals:

1. To support families by providing safe, caring, quality after school childcare.
2. To provide a comfortable and happy environment, based on respect, where children can develop to their fullest potential through:
  - cooperative play
  - interpersonal relationships
  - self-awareness and self-respect
  - health and nutrition
  - creative expression
  - physical skill development/recreation
  - developing values
  - group dynamics
  - development of cognitive skills
  - exposure to new activities and situations

## Daily Schedule:

- 2:45-3:00** ~ Children arrive at TASP and walk to Chapel with adults
- 3:00-3:15** ~ Group meetings
- 3:15-4:00** ~ Outside play
- 4:00-4:20** ~ Transition inside, wash hands, snack
- 4:20-4:45** ~ Quiet time: self-selected activities: homework group, board games, arts, crafts, play, reading, planned activities/projects
- 4:45-5:15** ~ Choice activities are offered. May be outside, in the Meeting Hall or in the Program Space. Children may choose to play games, do projects, socialize and play.
- 5:15-5:30** ~ Clean up: Children and staff work together to pack away materials and tidy up. Then play resumes with a game or activity.
- 5:30-5:45** ~ Staff finish closing up while last children are picked up.

## Program Activities and Philosophy:

Our program is designed to be flexible and to respond to the children's needs and interests. A variety of activities are offered with a view to introducing children to new skills and hobbies. Structured activities include outdoor and indoor recreation, art and craft activities, study and reading time, special projects, enrichment programs and field trips. Children also have opportunities for free time, board games, books, toys and dress-up.

Enrichment opportunities are presented by specialists and have included science programs, clown workshop, banner making, sewing, making hoola hoops, gingerbread workshop, music, drama and yo-yo tricks.

During Conference half-days enrichment activities are brought into the program. We have had Seeing Eye and K-9 Unit working dogs, magicians, clowns, story tellers, birds of prey, snakes and animals, music and sports activities.

A nutritious snack following NYS CACFP guidelines for healthy food and beverage choices is served daily.

We believe that an after school program should be less structured than the school day, while still providing educational experiences. We work on reinforcing social skills using conflict resolution techniques and time away to calm down. We embrace the concept that TASP is our children's neighborhood.

We feel that children should be involved in community service and organize activities like: raking wood chips on the school playground, cleaning the 'pit' at the middle school, weeding, designed and maintain the ES entrance garden, decorate a community tree for the holiday food drive, making dog toys and catnip mice and beds for the SPCA and shawls for Cayuga Ridge Nursing Home.
